Dear Mr. Madani,

On behalf of Carrier Global Corporation, I would like to express my support of the proposed **M-FBC-R Ch 46 – Glitch #1** submitted by Mrs. Hickman.

The existing glitch in the FBC Residential creates an inconsistency between the Mechanical and the Residential parts of the 8<sup>th</sup> Edition of the FBC for the same standard:

- Mechanical references the 2019 Edition of UL 60335-2-40
- Residential references the superseded 2012 Edition of UL 60335-2-40

As of today, only the 2019 Edition (and the most recent 2022 Edition referenced in the 2024 Edition of the I-Codes) is considered by UL for testing, certification and listing of HVAC equipment.

The 2012 Edition mistakenly referenced in the 8<sup>th</sup> Edition 2023 of the FBC Residential was superseded by the 2019 Edition. HVAC equipment can no longer be listed to the 2012 Edition of UL 60335-2-40.

Without the proposed change, Carrier – and all manufacturers – will be unable to supply HVAC equipment compliant with the FBC Residential.

Therefore, we urge the Commission to approve the proposal **M-FBC-R Ch 46 – Glitch #1**.

Under the leadership of your Office, I am confident that this update will be soon implemented in the Florida Building Code - Residential and I remain at your disposal for any additional information you may need.
