COMMISSION PLENARY SESSION

Agenda Review and Approval

The Commission voted unanimously, 16 - 0 in favor, to approve the agenda as presented.

Review and Approval of May 14, 2002 Meeting Minutes

Commission voted unanimously, 16 - 0 in favor, to approve the minutes as amended for the May 2002 Commission meeting. *Commission Actions:* Walter Smith was appointed to the Fire TAC and not the Energy TAC as reported. Med Kopczynski moved to New Hampshire and not Vermont as reported.

Motion — The Commission voted unanimously, by a vote of 19 – 0 in favor, to approve Window and Door Manufacturers Association's application for entity approval for certification agency and validation entity contingent on receipt of certification of ANSI accreditation, on-line electronic submission of application data, and payment to be made within 45 days.

Motion – The Commission voted unanimously, by a vote of 19 – 0 in favor, to approve Miami-Dade County Building Code Compliance Office for evaluation entity, validation entity, and accreditation body.

Motion — The Commission voted unanimously, by a vote of 19 – 0 in favor, to approve Southern Building Code Congress International for evaluation entity.

Motion — The Commission voted unanimously, by a vote of 19 – 0 in favor, to approve Keystone Certifications for certification agency and validation entity.

Education Program Oversight Committee and Education TAC Committee Report and Recommendations

Commissioner Browdy presented the committee's report and recommendations for Commission consideration. The Commission unanimously accepted the Committee's report by a vote of 19 - 0 in favor. (See Commission Minutes for Committee report)

Commission/BOAF Project to Develop Non-binding Code Interpretation Process

BOAF president Ronnie Spooner, presented a proposed flowchart for reviewing and issuing informal non-binding interpretations on the Florida Building Code. (Attachment 3)

Commission Actions:

Motion — The Commission voted unanimously, by a vote of 17 – 0 in favor, to approve the proposed informal non-binding interpretation process and flowchart for issuing interpretations on the Florida Building Code with the following clarifications: Building/Fire TAC should be included as a part of the review process.

BOAF should provide the Commission with the names and licensing qualifications of those individuals reviewing interpretation requests.

Legal Staff Report

Commission attorney Jim Richmond, reported that Governor Bush has signed HB 1307.

Second Workshop on Development of Policy for Relationship of the Florida Building Code to the International Codes

Chairman Rodriguez indicated that the purpose of this series of workshops is to solicit public comment on the relationship between the FBC and the IBC prior to the Commission taking this issue up for consideration as a body. He indicated that today's workshop would be the second workshop the Commission has held on this issue, the first was at the May 2002 meeting. The Chairman emphasised that this is an important policy issue that the Commission will discuss and evaluate the options and pros and cons as a full Commission in a facilitated process.

Comments from Workshop

- 1. The Commission should advise the IBC of the availability of FBC code changes for IBC review and consideration.
- 2. The FBC should review the IBC for possible code changes, but only on a Florida specific basis.
- 3. BOAF requests that the Commission adopt the IBC family of codes as the base code for the Florida Building Code.
- 4. FIMA requests that Florida adopt the International Family of Codes (IBC).

Chairman Rodriguez reopened the workshop prior to the conclusion of the Commission meeting in order to allow additional comment on the topic. There were no additional comments made.

Public Comment

There were 2 members of the public who addressed the Commission during the first public comment period. Chairman Rodriguez opened a second public comment period prior to the conclusion of the Commission meeting in order to allow additional public comment for Commission consideration. Several interests used this opportunity to address the Commission.
