Course: Advanced FBC 8th Edition (2023) Metal Roofing

This is a 2-hour instructor led course that provides an overview of metal roofing materials and coatings before discussing sections of the Florida Building Code, Building Chapter 15 pertaining to metal roofing. Code topics include definitions, weather protection, performance requirements, fire classification, materials, roof coverings, product approvals, exposure categories, risk categories and uplift requirements. Industry warranties, best practices and installation issues are also covered.

This is a 2-hour online course that reviews & explains the new ADA Standards for Accessible Design that were published in September, 2010 and became mandatory in March 15, 2012. The Florida Building Code fully accepts these standards and provides for some more restrictive criteria which will be addressed.

After an administrative review of this course, it was found that...

- a. The "Method of Course Evaluation" was missing
- b. The "Method of Course Presentation" was missing.
- c. The "7th Edition" should be changed to "8th Edition" in the BCIS course title
- d. The Certificate of Completion was missing, but not required
- e. **As a result, I recommend denial of this course because it does not meet the full requirements of Rule 61G20-6.002. However, the ED POC could motion to instead conditionally approve this course, subject to adding the "Method of Course Evaluation" and "Method of Course Presentation", and changing the "7th Edition" to "8th Edition" in the BCIS course title**
