- 1. 553.73(7)(e) A rule updating the Florida Building Code in accordance with this subsection shall take effect no sooner than 6 months after publication of the updated code. Any amendment to the Florida Building Code which is adopted upon a finding by the commission that the amendment is necessary to protect the public from immediate threat of harm takes effect immediately.
- 2. 61G20-2.002(3): "Each amendment approved for adoption by the Florida Building Commission pursuant to Section 553.73(9), F.S., shall take effect no earlier than three months after the rule amendment is filed for adoption with the Department of State."
