Enter explanation of how the Petitioner's substantial interests are being affected by the local interpretation of the Florida Building Code

In 2013, Accent Closets leased an approximately 7,700 sq. ft. within an approximately 55,0000 sq. ft. warehouse. Accent intended to, and does use, the space to operate its closet assembly business. Prior to entering into the lease, Accent initiated a voluntary fire inspection to ensure it could use the space for its intended purposes. Accent was cleared following the fire inspection and has passed every fire inspection annually up until 2021. In 2019, Accent entered into a new 5-year lease. In July of 2021, the City failed Accent, claiming that because it operates a saw within the space Accent is required to install automatic sprinklers pursuant to 903.2.4.1. Accent's "woodworking" operations, as categorized by the City, does not exceed 2,500 sq. ft. In fact, its "woodworking" operations occur in 1,319 sq. ft. Accent Closets applied for a building permit in or around June 2022. The Fire Prevention division maintained its position that sprinklers are required and rejected the permit application. At this

juncture, the City will not issue the permit unless fire sprinklers are installed. Accent Closets cannot install automatic fire sprinklers without a fire line, in a building it does not own. Further, Accent Closets cannot enclose a fire area smaller than 2,500 sq. ft. as it would restrict movement and access to the machinery in a way that would negatively impact the operation of its business. FBC Section 903.2.4.1 states that: "An automatic sprinkler system shall be provided throughout all Group F1 occupancy fire areas that contain woodworking operations in excess of 2,500 square feet in areas which generate finely divided combustible waste or use finely divided combustible materials. Is an automatic sprinkler system required where the woodworking area noted above comprises 2,500 square feet or less of the overall F-1 fire area?

Petitioner is seeking a Binding Interpretation which is consistent with the informal interpretation (attached). Specifically, Petitioner seeks a Binding Interpretation which states that: "[t]he extent of sprinkler coverage is only intended to be for the Group F-1 occupancy involved in the woodworking activity. If the fire area is larger than 2,500 square feet (232 m2) but the woodworking area is 2,500 square feet (232 m2) or less, sprinklers are not required. It is not the intent to require the installation of sprinklers throughout the building but rather in the fire area where the hazard may be present."
